

January Curates Corner

Dear Friends,

I wonder if you, like many, have made a New Year's resolution for 2024? I must confess, I have never been very good at keeping resolutions. Last year it was the famous gym membership, I lasted until mid-February before deciding that was not for me. In other years I have decided to eat healthier food, but again – never lasted too long!

The tradition of New Year's resolutions is said to go back to 2000BC, when the Babylonians used the new year, the time in which they planted their seeds, to repay their debts and return the equipment they had borrowed. Rather than something focused on themselves, these promises where about returning other's possessions, about back what was someone else's. Promises at the start of the new year marked a fresh beginning, a new start.

It wasn't until relatively modern times that resolutions took the form we see today: hopes, dreams, and desires for the year ahead, but of course, the essence is the same - these promises turn each year into a new threshold for hope, a fresh start that enables us to do that thing we have always planned on doing.

It is one of the traditions of the church that each morning during the daily prayer service we open with the following:

I probably will make a resolution this year, and it probably won't last more than a month, but that's okay, because each and every day that lies open before us is a chance for a fresh start, a fresh chance to encounter ourselves, our friends, our family, and God with new and open minds filled with love.

The Garden in January



"Anyone who thinks that gardening begins in the spring and ends in the fall is missing the best part of the whole year; for gardening begins in January with the dream" -

Josephine Neuse.

January is the quietest month in the garden.... But just because it looks quiet doesn't mean nothing is happening. The soil, open to the sky, absorbs the pure rainfall while microorganisms convert dead plant material into usable nutrients for the next crop of plants. The feasting earthworms tunnel along, aerating the soil and preparing it to welcome the seeds and bare roots to come.

More than most months January gardening is very weather determined. Over recent years long very cold spells have become less common, while prolonged wet periods are.



Don't walk on waterlogged soil or you will cause compaction which makes it harder for air and water to get through the top layer (look at the effect

the pigs have on Lopham Road stopping the rain from soaking in and causing excessive run-off and loss of soil from the fields.

If the soil is reasonably dry and frost free there are many jobs that can usefully be carried out this month.

<u>Shrubs and young trees</u> After the strong winds of the autumn these may have rocked about, and need the soil firming around them, and possibly staking. It is a good time to tidy up and remove dead and damaged wood.

<u>Grapes</u> If practical untie and lay down the stems. Tie back in next month. This encourages the sap to move throughout the whole plant which gives rise to more new growth and better fruiting

<u>Deciduous hedges</u> can be cut hard to encourage new growth before the birds start nesting towards the end of February.

<u>Dahlias</u>. If you dug and stored your dahlia tubers, they should be checked and use a fungicide if needed.

<u>Potatoes.</u> If you have space in a cool room to spread out some seed potatoes, they have been in the garden centres since before Christmas (far too early!) it is worth buying a few to have a better choice of varieties. Cardboard egg boxes/ trays are

ideal for spreading them out. Don't leave them in their plastic bags, and certainly not in the dark. Plant under fleece in a cold greenhouse in late February, but not outdoors until mid-March onwards.

<u>**Bulbs**</u> Bring last pots of Hyacinths and other bulbs indoors to force early flowering – don't subject to excessive heat or over water or they will stretch and become leggy.

Lilies can be planted indoors for an early display under glass or in the house.

<u>House plants</u> Remove faded flowers and leaves. Do not over water. Give plenty of light, but don't leave behind curtains at night, even with double glazing it can get very cold.

<u>Fruit Trees</u> Continue winter pruning (not cherries, apricots, peaches or plums which are prone to fungal diseases if open wounds are left).



<u> Tales Of Old Harling 20.</u>

(Its lost lanes and hidden highways 4)

THE HARLING DROVE. An eastern link? David Bailey.



Marked on old maps as the 'Harling Drove', it was a route used for many centuries to move herds of cattle and large flocks of sheep from their lush green pastures in the Norfolk Fens to markets in this corner of Breckland. Traditionally, as its name implies, East Harling was its chief destination. In Medieval times some larger villages were granted Royal Market Charters which enabled them to hold regular markets* and be called 'Market Towns'. East Harling was granted its Charter in 1474 for a weekly market and from then until the early 19th century was also known as 'Market Harling'. Five additional markets and fairs were also permitted to be held each year---- sheep, cattle and bullocks (May, September and October) and lambs (April and July). The lamb on our village sign testifies to the contribution these famous sheep sales made to Harling's prosperity throughout those years. From 1845

the ancient Harling Drove Road gradually slipped into disuse when the railways did the same job. After many centuries of use, the Harling Drove and its original importance is almost forgotten. I hope this article will remedy this.

A 14 mile section of the original Harling Drove can still be traced via existing lanes, trackways and rights-of-way. Its ancient route began at Hockwold, then, passing between Weeting and Brandon, skirted the River Little Ouse at Santon Downham before crossing the Icknield Way 4 miles north of Thetford. With watering stops at either Fowl Mere, Lang Mere or Ring Mere it reached Roudham Heath at the Peddars Way junction, just 3 miles from Harling, where its course is no longer marked as 'Harling Drove' on old maps. Understandably, its original route is unclear across Roudham's ancient heath, but it reappears, unnamed, along an existing lane near Roudham Church to become the road to Harling before turning southwards towards the welcome site of water at the Harling Ford. It must have been a wonderful sight watching huge flocks of sheep drinking at the ford opposite our church in April and June each year. Up to 20,000 lambs flocked here from all corners of Breckland before being herded along Church Lane to their pens on the sale ground that stretched behind what is now the fire station, White Hart St and down to Fen Lane. It was also a great social occasion, people and drovers came from all over and it wasn't only the publicans of Harling's twelve pubs that benefited, the village kids would have earned extra pocket money helping tipsy drovers stopping their sheep wandering off!

Traces of ancient drove roads exist all across Britain. They differed from established systems of lanes by being extra -wide and were often bounded by hedges, ditches or earthen banks to help drovers keep their livestock in check. They are impossible to date, they had been there forever! The Droves were rarely metalled, or planned like Roman roads, they simply developed according to need, so we shouldn't just view the Harling Drove as a continuous road for a single purpose, i.e. driving sheep and cattle from the Fens direct to Market Harling. It must have had a much wider, local use.

So did the Harling Drove Road continue eastwards? Could it have once connected directly with other local market towns--or even further?

I believe it is possible, and that the most likely candidate is the Quidenham Road out of Harling, it is straight, has unusually wide and hedged verges and goes in the right direction—If only the Albemarle Estate at Quidenham wasn't in the way!

A line drawn eastwards from the Harling sheep sale-ground follows the Quidenham road as straight as an arrow for two miles, then comes to an abrupt stop at the Kenninghall Road junction where the way ahead is barred by the Quidenham estate's western boundary. Could this line have continued across the estate? If so, what could have been its destination?

BIG GARDEN BIRD WATCH AND COP 28 REPORT

(thanks to the RSPB for this Editor)

I hope you have already read the Eco-church letter this month on the Big Garden Bird Watch on page 16. This is a citizen science project of real value to all those movers and shakers that can do something about changing the ecological environment for the better for the FUTURE!! Believe it or not this includes you!.

As we are probably all aware, climate change is one of the greatest threats to birds and other wildlife, and both nature and the climate are in a state of emergency. The COP 28 which took place in Dubai this last Nov/Dec did offer a chance for countries of the world to make real positive change. But time is running out. To tackle climate change, we need to do two things: rapidly replace the usage of fossil fuels with clean 'green' energy, and protect our precious ecosystems, including peat bogs, woodlands and wetlands

that lock in carbon. If we don't restore nature, mitigating climate change isn't going to happen.

We know that any action on climate must also be joined up with action on nature. The science is very clear that we must tackle the nature and climate emergencies together, to be successful at either. So The RSPB we were there to be a voice of nature – it was our opportunity to represent our members and supporters on a world stage, and to ensure that the role of nature in the climate emergency is acknowledged.

The RSPB had a simple message – we can't forget the role of nature in the climate change debate, and actions for the climate must also work for nature.

If governments do their bit for the climate, it must benefit nature too. So they must invest in nature, whether that's expanding the native woodlands, restoring peatlands, and protecting critical coastland wetlands. These nature-based solutions, which include bringing more green spaces to our towns and cities have a role to play in tackling climate change. But these aren't an alternative to phasing out the use of fossil fuels, which needs to happen both rapidly and urgently. For a safe climate future, we need to drastically reduce how much we use fossil fuels... and also allow nature to thrive.

One simple step is to nurture the bees, and provide food and water these essential insects for pollination and germination of all our food plants. Whether you have a window box, allotment or large garden, planting bee-friendly flowers can help boost your local bumblebee population. In return, they pollinate our flowers, crops, fruits and



vegetables .If you have space, you can do your bit for bumblebees by planting at least two kinds of bee-friendly flower for every flowering period (spring, summer, autumn and winter).

The best habitats for bumblebees are those that offer plenty of flowers to feed on during the entire active phase of the bumblebees' lifecycle (from March until October). This will ensure that there is a good supply of pollen at all of the crucial times, including when queens are nesting, when the nest is growing and when new queens are fattening up ready for hibernation!

Gardening is for everyone, so get the children involved, your friends and local community and start growing a haven for bumblebees!

From 26th – 28th January our church community will be joining in with the RSPB's Big Garden Birdwatch along with ½ million other people in the UK. If you haven't taken part before, you can help provide a vital snapshot over one weekend to see how our garden birds are faring. This gives a good general impression of the birds that are doing well, and the ones that are struggling.

Last year, the top 5 birds seen were, in order - sparrow, blue tit, starling, wood pigeon and blackbird. In the last 50 years we have lost 38 million birds from our skies so it is crucial that we do everything we can to look after them.

All you have to do is take one hour, the best time is in the morning, and choose

the woods and count the birds that land on the ground. Or come up to the churchyard and sign up for an hour there. We will have hot drinks ready for you!

If you are a real beginner, you can look on www.wildlifetrusts.org/gardenbirds for photos of the most common garden birds. Then report your findings to rspb.org.uk even if you see nothing!

While we are waiting for the bird count....

We might think about how we can give nature a helping hand by feeding the garden birds, putting up nest boxes ready for spring and gardening in a wildlife-friendly way – actions that can make all the difference to nature.

Tips for feeding the birds

- If you are going to start feeding the birds, don't stop as birds will soon start using your bird table or feeder as part of their daily routine.
- Keep feeders and bird tables clean and take away any uneaten food
- Don't trim any hedges or trees that have berries on – leave them for the birds
- In the winter, birds need high energy, high fat foods.
- Put out a good mix of peanuts, seeds, mealworms and waxworms.
- Fruit, especially bruised apples and pears, will be popular with thrushes and blackbirds.
- Household scraps like pastry, cooked rice and breadcrumbs should only be offered in small amounts occasionally.
- Don't forget to put out shallow bowls of clean water, especially when it is frosty.

Old field boundary maps of the Quidenham estate, NOW A PRIVATE PROPERTY WITH NO PUBLIC ACCESS, show that a direct through-route did once exist, aligning perfectly with the Quidenham Road and includes an ideal spot for watering herds of cattle or sheep as it fords the River Whittle. This route through the estate re-emerges at its eastern boundary where it joins the road recorded in ancient times as 'Ickenield Street' (less romantically now known as the B 1113).

This ancient road connects the two market towns of Kenninghall and New Buckenham. The route now continues northerly along Ickenield Street to New Buckenham where, within sight of its 12th century castle, a crossroad leads either north to Attleborough or south to Diss. Is it a coincidence that during medieval times each of these towns, along with Harling, were all those granted market charters? Now, here's an interesting observation to consider--Ickenield Street continues straight on from New Buckenham to Norwich (via Mulbarton) as the B1113, a road still widely used today as a convenient alternative route to Norwich if there are hold ups on the A11.

So why did this potential route from Market Harling fall into disuse? You have probably guessed by now that at some point in history an Earl of Albemarle diverted the road to go around the outer boundaries of his estate. I wonder what the Drovers thought about it?

So, in summary, it is conceivable that this proposed route from Harling along the Quidenham Road may once have been an extension of the ancient Harling Drove. It would have been a quicker, more convenient choice of routes to and from local market towns* --and a quicker, more direct route to Norwich for the more intrepid traveller.


