# Dear friends

I was truly blessed, during the weekend that I am writing this, to officiate at a wedding in Wymondham Abbey, for parishioners of East Harling. It was my first time in that Church – and it really is a stunning building. It will perhaps not be a surprise that, as a Priest, I am very interested in Church art and architecture, and the Abbey is a very grand example of both.

And yet, two things kept resonating in my mind. The millennium-long history of that place just heightened the sense for me of the smallness and ordinariness of the human story that unfolded during that wedding. This beautiful couple and their amazing daughters were coming

into that place, just one little family, and making their promises to each other, and then leaving again to get on with their lives. And the power and beauty of what this little family was committing itself to just had a life, a vitality, that nothing in that magnificent Church (or any Church, Abbey or Cathedral) could match. The beating heart of that vitality was, of course, love. The couple getting married held hands, and looked into each others' eyes, and the love being expressed there was a true glimpse of the love of God, right in front of us.

I also, on entering the Abbey and looking at the beauty of the building, couldn't help but immediately think of Jesus going to the Temple in Jerusalem, and telling the disciples, marvelling at the beauty of that building, that not one stone would remain on top of another. Because every Temple, every Church, Abbey – any building, or creation made by human hands – is only temporary. Jesus was right – within 100 years, the Temple was destroyed. But he said he had come to build another Temple … but this was a community of love, bound together by hope, joy, love – the power of the Spirit of God.

We're at a point in history where we are reaping what we, as a race, have sown in terms of international conflict, environmental catastrophe, economic imbalance ... and I am praying for ways out of these things, and to play my part in anything that I can do to reverse some of these things. But this weekend has reminded me that love is, in the end, the only eternal thing that we can be part of. Not just the love of a married couple – but the love, in any form, that chooses the other, that sees and holds on to the value of each human person that we encounter.

Buildings, organisations, traditions – all of these things can be wonderful and beautiful. But none of them are worth anything – except inasmuch as they remind us and point us towards the reality of love, and help us to live in that love. I pray that you will, amidst everything else in these coming months, have your eyes open that you may love those around you, and be able to receive the love of others. As we love one another, seeing the worth and infinite value of each other, together we build something that outshines any Church or Temple.

# EAST HARLING & KENNINGHALL MEDICAL PRACTICE DECEMBER 2022

# **NEWSLETTER UPDATE**

At the time of writing, with the first cold spell of weather now with us, the Practice remains extremely busy.

We have now implemented the upgraded telephone system to help address patient feedback in respect of the previous system cutting calls off. The upgraded system has 3 options to choose from, so please listen carefully to the initial message on calling the Practice to select the most appropriate option.

Our busiest day since the telephone system was upgraded saw 1,277 attempted calls to the Practice in 1 day, which equates to 138 calls per hour.

There is now a dedicated repeat prescription option on the telephone lines (option 2), which is available 10am – 1pm Monday- Friday. Repeat prescriptions can also be requested online via our website, or by dropping the repeat request at either of our Practice sites.

Our website (<a href="https://www.eh-khsurgery.co.uk/">https://www.eh-khsurgery.co.uk/</a>) also has a lot of useful information to help patients and is regularly updated.

Our final Saturday flu clinic for this year has now been completed, but if you have not had your vaccination, and are eligible for it, please contact the Practice if you would like to arrange a vaccination.

Unfortunately, we continue to see a high number of appointments not attended, the total for November being 155. This is the equivalent of 5 full days of the appointment capacity for 1 GP. Please do contact us as soon as you are aware that you are unable to attend an appointment (whether this is a face to face or telephone appointment) as, even at very short notice, it is highly likely that we will be able to offer the appointment to another patient. Our website can be used to inform us of a cancelled appointment.

### THE GARDEN IN JANUARY

There is nothing to do in the garden in January .... Don't you believe it. Mother Nature is still busy doing all manner of things out of sight.

January opens
The box of the year
And brings out days
That are bright and clear
And brings out days
That are cold and grey
And shouts, "Come see
What I brought today
-by Leland B Jacobs, January

More than most months January gardening is very weather determined. Over recent years long very cold spells have become less common, while prolonged wet periods have become the norm and this has led to compaction which makes it harder for air and water to get through the top layer (look at the effect the pigs have on Lopham Road, stopping the rain from soaking in and causing excessive run-off and loss of soil from the fields). [Ed. - Why don't farmers move the animals around to prevent this happening – it has led to serious flooding in past winters - remember Kenninghall last year?]

If the soil is reasonably dry and frost free there are many jobs that can usefully carried out this month.

### Shrubs and young trees

After the strong winds of the autumn these may have rocked about, and need the soil firming around them, and possibly staking. It is a good time to tidy up and remove dead and damaged wood.

<u>Grapes</u> If practical untie and lay down the stems. Tie back in next month. This encourages the sap to move throughout the whole plant which gives rise to more new growth and better fruiting.

<u>Deciduous hedges</u> can be cut hard to encourage new growth before the birds start nesting towards the end of February.

<u>Dahlias</u>. If you dug and stored your dahlia tubers these should be checked and use a fungicide if needed.

Potatoes. If you have space in a cool room to spread out some seed potatoes, they have been in the garden centres since before Christmas (far too early!) it is worth buying a few to have a better choice of varieties. Cardboard egg boxes/ trays are ideal for spreading them out. Don't leave them in their plastic bags, and certainly not in the dark. First and second earlies don't need chitting (leaving in warm light position until short sturdy shoots appear). Plant them under fleece in a cold greenhouse in late February, don't plant outdoors until mid-March onwards.

<u>Bulbs</u> Bring last pots of Hyacinths and other bulbs indoors to force early flowering – don't subject to excessive heat or over water or they will stretch and become leggy.

<u>Lilies</u> can be planted indoors for an early display under glass or in the house.

House plants Remove faded flowers and leaves. Do not over water. Give plenty of light, but don't leave behind curtains at night, even with double glazing it can get very cold.

<u>Fruit Trees</u> Continue winter pruning ( not cherries, apricots, peaches or plums which are subject to fungal diseases if open wounds are left).



### SARAID's international USAR assessment

On Monday 19<sup>th</sup> September 2022 at 11.30pm the United Nations Global Disaster Alert and Coordination System (GDACS) sent out an alert of a magnitude 7.8 earthquake that had struck the "Republic of Angloland", and within minutes this message was picked up by the volunteer members across the UK of Search and Rescue Assistance in Disasters (SARAID) International Response Team.



SARAID is a UK based Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) & Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) and all its members are 100% unpaid volunteers. Now luckily this wasn't a

real disaster alert but the start of SARAID's <u>United Nations International Search and Rescue Advisory Group</u> (UN INSARAG) Light Urban Search and Rescue Team INSARAG External Classification (IEC) Exercise.

The exercise was the culmination of 8 years of preparation and planning by the teams' members & management, which had been delayed due to the COVID 19 pandemic and lock down. INSARAG is a global network of more than 90 countries and organisations under the United Nations umbrella. INSARAG deals with urban search and rescue (USAR) related issues, aiming to establish minimum international standards for USAR teams methodology for international coordination earthquake response. The IEC exercise is a peerbased review to test a team's operational capabilities to ensure that only that they meet the INSARAG minimum standards and that only qualified and USAR resources appropriate international deployed to an emergency.

In the days preceding the "emergency" a group of 7 international classifiers from Australia, France, Germany, Spain and the Czech Republic came to the UK, to begin the final process of assessing SARAID against an IEC checklist of 157 areas. These covered management, logistics, search, rescue and medical elements as well as internal processes, eg alert, activation and mobilisation process. They also assessed the training program and records, standard operating procedures, policy documents, team equipment cache, risk assessments, recruitment and selection process and administrative systems and much more.

The team of classifiers also visited SARAID's USAR equipment store at Yate Fire Station to carry out a thorough assessment of the team's operational equipment cache including medical stock. They also met with the teams Equipment Store Manager, Logistics Manager and Medical Manager to examine and evaluate all policies and procedures. This was on the day of Queen Elizabeth II funeral, and everyone took time out to watch the funeral on TV as well as joining members of Avon Fire & Rescue to pay their respects with a 2-minute silence outside the front of the fire station.

During the early hours of Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> September, the teams Alert and Activation protocols were followed and by 07.00hrs the selected team of 23 personnel had all arrived at Yate Fire Station and were on

Stand-By to deploy. The team of Classifiers observed the Mobilisation phase of pre-deployment medical checks, information gathering on the affected country, safety and security briefings and the constant updating of the Virtual On Site Operations and Coordination Centre (VOSOCC or VO). This is the first online coordination hub and main information gathering site for all international USAR teams and is a website managed by the UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA).

By 11.00am all the team's equipment and team members were loaded onto vehicles to begin the simulated "flight" from the UK to the "Republic of Angloland". The team arrived at Gloucester Staverton Airport to undergo passport checks, issue of visa's, immigration and customs procedures, all carried out in the arrivals lounge of the airport. The team's equipment manifest and dangerous goods declaration was thoroughly inspected by customs officers to ensure required items had been packed and labelled according to IATA's Dangerous Goods Regulations. At the airport SARAID's Coordination Support Team members assisted members of @fire International Disaster Response Germany (@fire Internationaler Katastrophenschultz Deutschland (a German nonprofit, non-governmental organisation). Our German colleagues had gone through the same IEC process a few months before and became the first INSARAG classified Light USAR Team in the world, to set up and run a Reception and Departure Centre (RDC). This centre then provides other incoming teams with a focal and information point in-country and supports the airport management. This is a requirement within the INSARAG Guidelines.

Following an up-to-date situation briefing with SARAID's Team Leader and Rescue Operations Manager and a 'role player' being from the "Republic of Angloland's" Ministry of Interior, the team then moved off by road to their given area of operations, which was at the Fire Service College at Moreton-in-the-Marsh.

On arrival at the Fire Service College the team reported to the USAR Coordination Cell (UCC) again which had already been set up by our colleagues from @Fire Germany. The team were given an area where they could begin to set up their Base of Operations, a tented base camp consisting of multiple tents for personal sleeping, communications, management, medical, toilets/showers and decontamination basically everything needed to be a home away from home.



Over the next two days the team would work continuously on the famous RIG5 at the Fire Service College, which for the purpose of the exercise became

the 5-star Intercontinental Hotel which had collapsed during the earthquake and had an unknown number of people still trapped inside.

The team would demonstrate to the classifiers the skills that had been taught and exercised over many years. Skills gained during operational deployments using different scenarios that would involve the use of a variety of technical search equipment. These included the Delsar, a seismic sensing device for detecting people trapped under rubble, the FL360 search camera, the SearchCam 2000 and SearchCam Recon.



The teams also used Makita power tools such as disc cutters and demolition drills in order to breach and break down 8" thick reinforced concrete slabs, and cutting through to gain access to casualties. Patient handling and patient care in confined spaces and when trapped under heavy beams as well as stretcher handling across an unstable rubble pile, were carried out. Rescue rope work, lowering a casualty 10 meters out of a window of a tower block on a stretcher with an attendant medic was completed successfully. Cribbing beams to prevent movement and lifting heavy 5 ton concrete slabs using a crane were all completed and 7 casualties were successfully located and extracted after medical intervention.



In addition to the manual skills there was also the administrative jobs that had to be completed using the INSARAG (International Search and Rescue Advisory Group) Coordination and Management System (ICMS). This uses a suite of mobile phone and computer apps such as ArchGIS Survey 123, Explorer and Dashboard where different groups and functions work together in different areas of the system to produce an information management system that enhances situational awareness and as a result improves coordination and outcomes for the affected communities. This system allows the user to collect data on a variety of categories and then link that collected information back to an online dashboard where decision makers in the UCC can use that information to make more informed decisions and plan tasks.

Late Thursday afternoon saw the exercise enter the demobilisation phase with the team preparing to pack up the base of operations and start to plan to return home.

SARAID felt very honoured and privileged to have both Mr Sebastian Rhodes Stampa, Chief of Emergency Response Section, UN OCHA and Mr Winston Chang, INSARAG Unit Head attend the exercise as official observers, and on Thursday evening after the end of the exercise, the SARAID team members attended a presentation ceremony to find out the outcome of their endeavours. Mr Brad Commens AFSM, Chief Superintendent and Director of Specialist and Technical Response for Queensland and Emergency Service who was international classifiers team leader hiahlv commended the team on their efforts and then handed over to Sebastian Rhodes Stampa who confirmed that SARAID had successfully passed the IEC with flying colours to become the first and only UK voluntary team to be an INSARAG Classified Light USAR Team and only the third worldwide. presented Gary Francis, SARAID's Executive Director & IEC Exercise Director, and Will Selley, SARAID's Director of Operations and IEC Exercise Controller, with the official INSARAG certificate and plaque and all team members with their INSARAG patches. After the official celebrations the team enjoyed a few wellearned beers.



We must not forget the dedicated group of SARAID volunteer team members working tirelessly behind the scenes. They made up the Exercise Control (ExCon), a support team of role-players, casualties and drivers without whom the exercise would not have been possible. These people together with the 10 members of @Fire Germany who had travelled over from Germany to provide support to the team. We also give our grateful thanks to Mr Belit Tasdemir from AKUT Search and Rescue Association Turkey who was SARAID's official Mentor and guided and advised the team throughout the entire planning, preparation and operational phases of the exercise.

People rarely consider a charity such as ours until a disaster hits the headlines, we receive no Government funding or funding from the DEC (Disasters Executive Committee), we rely on public donations and sponsorship or support from commercial companies for equipment.

# PLEASE HELP SAVE YOUR VILLAGE SPEEDWATCH



Over the last seven years or so a few dedicated individuals, working in teams of three, have devoted many hours monitoring the speeds of vehicles at various sites around the village. Speeders have been reported to the Police and offenders receive appropriate

letters warning of their behaviour. Repeat offenders have been further pursued. There are now hundreds of such teams in villages around the country. They are considered by the Police to be a major part of their efforts to improve road safety. We believe that in East Harling there is now greater awareness that speeding is unacceptable, largely due to our efforts.

But we are constantly struggling to run sessions as often as we, and you, the villagers, would like. In the New Year we will only have four or five people who are prepared to operate as often as needed. Another two or three can only participate from time to time. All are now 7 years older than when the scheme started. Some of us have bad backs, etc. and cannot stand for

to read a number plate and record it. But anyone could help if they are able to make a regular commitment.

Training will be given as authorised by Norfolk Police, and applicants need to have no criminal record, as we are there representing the Police, but without all the powers of a constable. We are provided with Hi Vis jackets.

If we had enough volunteers, we could run a weekly session and individuals would only need to turn out every few weeks. If we cannot operate

sufficiently often, the Police will require us to return the equipment. They have a number of villages just waiting to get their hands on it.

We were threatened with demise because I, myself have decided to call it a day as coordinator. I was in at the start and I am 84. No one seemed likely to take the job on until our most recent recruit stepped into the breach. Thank you, Paula. I wish you well.


